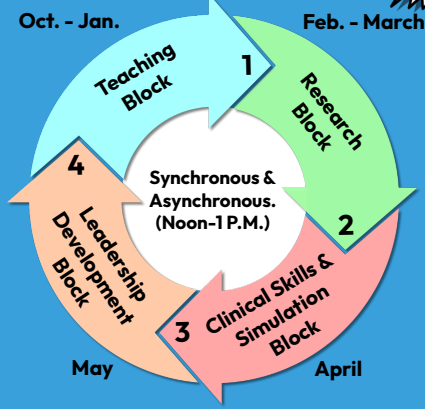
Institutional Faculty Development Program (IFDP)

- Offered annually, eight months in length.
- Synchronous and asynchronous courses (Canvas), face-to-face sessions, panel discussions and workshops.

Graduation requirements: Minimum 40 credits.

Three projects required:

- 1) Oral presentation.
- 2) Knowledge application project in the Teaching block.
- 3) Knowledge application project in the Research block.

Leadership Development Academy (LDA)

- Offered every odd year, eight months in length.
- Synchronous and asynchronous courses (Canvas), face-to-face sessions, panel discussions and workshops.

Graduation requirements: Minimum 20 credits.

One project required: Leadership proposal of your choosing.
